



# Challenges to the AAPI Community

Between 2000-2019, the Asian American population in California grew by more than 2 million, the largest growth in the U.S. With this growth comes unsolved challenges. (Pew)

From 2020 to 2021, anti-AAPI hate crimes have increased by 342%. 40% of those crimes have been reported in California, home to the nation's largest AAPI population. (CBS News)

AAPI's are the most underrepresented in politics at negative 85% relative to the their population in 2020. (Reflective Democracy Campaign)

In philanthropy, communities of AAPI have received less than 0.5% of charitable giving. (Asian American Foundation) More than 84% of AAPI small business have reported negative business effects from the pandemic. Almost half have laid off staff. (National Asian Chamber of Commerce & Entrepreneurship)

Even though AAPI's on average have a high household income, because of certain struggling AAPI groups, AAPI's actually have a higher poverty rate 12.3% than non-Hispanic whites at 9.8%. Over 30% of Southeast Asians live in welfare, with 20% of Cambodians living below the poverty line. (NPR)

Our goal is to graduate a new cadre of AAPI business leaders each year prepared to enter key positions in government in order to make a difference in people's lives.

# Working to advance economic equity within California's cannabis industry



Since the cannabis market was legalized in California, the Foundation has served as a trusted forum for education and technical assistance about business ownership and employment opportunities for minority businesses; especially those considered disadvantaged. Working in close partnership with local governments who fund our outreach and training efforts, the Foundation has developed an extensive market knowledge based on a professional network of state and local regulators, elected officials and staff, industry partners, investors, diverse entrepreneurs, and community stakeholders.

255 businesses graduated from our Sacramento incubator program from 2019-2021.

18 social equity owned businesses currently in operation (as of March 2021).


